LGBTQ+ in STEM: Spotlight on Lianna Newman

Today, we're highlighting the work of Lianna Newman at Booz Allen Hamilton.

Lianna is a Full Stack
Software Engineer and
previously worked as a
Human Resources Specialist
before venturing into
Technology and Robotics in
2016. During this time,
Lianna faced a lot of

discrimination during interviews, frequently being misgendered and marked as 'too aggressive', which left a feeling of general unwelcomeness in the field.

Lianna took these
experiences and built a
passion to make the tech
space more inclusive and
welcoming. In Lianna's own

the same year Lianna also accepted the role of Director of External Affinity Groups for <u>oSTEM</u> after being awarded the <u>2018</u> <u>oSTEM Partner Excellence Award</u>.

Today's key figure in British LGBTQ+ history is <u>Roberta Cowell</u>. Born as 'Robert' in 1918's Croydon, Roberta was always enthusiastic about engineering, and soon after leaving school went on to drive and work on racing cars.

In 1936, she studied engineering at <u>UCL</u>, whilst competing in the <u>Antwerp Grand Prix in 1939</u>. In 1942 she became a spitfire pilot in the Royal Air Force and was taken as a prisoner-of-war by German troops for five months. After the war, Roberta started <u>racing more competitively</u> but was fighting against the growing discomfort with her body and wartime trauma. In 1948 she then started her trans journey and went on to be the <u>first British trans woman to undergo sex reassignment surgery</u>.
